The Power of Prophetic Blessing/Power of Words - Biblical Discussion What is prophecy? 1 Cor.14:1-5 | Matt.26:67-68 Acts 21:10-11 | 1 Cor.13:9 | reject.evil1. Thess.5:19-22.| 1. John.4:1.

The Word that God speaks to us is alive and full of power (**Heb 4:12**). That means that every time God releases His prophetic (or now) word to you, there is

supernatural power released to you to fulfill that very word. The Bible also says that: we can live by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God. There is a living substance and power in the words that God speaks to us, that will change things he **in** this natural realm.

Proverbs 18:21 Death and life are in the power of the tongue, and those who love it: will eat its fruits.

Matthew 15:18 But what comes out of the mouth proceeds from the heart, and this defiles a person.

Ephesians 4:29 Let no corrupting talk come out of your mouths, but only such as is good for building up, as fits the occasion, that it may give grace to those who hear.

Proverbs 12:18 There is one whose rash words are like sword thrusts, but the tongue of the wise brings healing.

Matthew 12:36 I tell you, on the day of judgment people will give account for every careless word they speak,

Proverbs 16:24 Gracious words are like a honeycomb, sweetness to the soul and health to the body.

Colossians 3:8 But now you must put them all away: anger, wrath, malice, slander, and obscene talk from your mouth.

Proverbs 13:3 Whoever guards his mouth preserves his life; he who opens wide his lips comes to ruin.

Matthew 12:37 For by your words you will be justified, and by your words you will be condemned."

Proverbs 15:1 A soft answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger.

Proverbs 21:23 Whoever keeps his mouth and his tongue keeps himself out of trouble.

Proverbs 29:20 Do you see a man who is hasty in his words? There is more hope for a fool than for him.

Proverbs 15:4 A gentle tongue is a tree of life, but perverseness in it breaks the spirit.

Proverbs 17:28 Even a fool who keeps silent is considered wise; when he closes his lips, he is deemed intelligent.

Proverbs 25:11 A word fitly spoken is like apples of gold in a setting of silver.

Romans 12:14 Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse them.

Proverbs 15:2 The tongue of the wise commends knowledge, but the mouths of fools pour out folly.

Luke 6:45 The good person out of the good treasure of his heart produces good, and the evil person out of his evil treasure produces evil, for out of the abundance of the heart his mouth speaks.

Proverbs 10:19 When words are many, transgression is not lacking, but whoever restrains his lips is prudent.

Proverbs 27:2 Let another praise you, and not your own mouth; a stranger, and not your own lips.

Colossians 4:6 Let your speech always be gracious, seasoned with salt, so that you may know how you ought to answer each person.

Proverbs 18:13 If one gives an answer before he hears, it is his folly and shame.

Matthew 12:34 You brood of vipers! How can you speak good, when you are evil? For out of the abundance of the heart the mouth speaks.

Proverbs 11:12 Whoever belittles his neighbor lacks sense, but a man of understanding remains silent.

Matthew 7:12 "So whatever you wish that others would do to you, do also to them, for this is the Law and the Prophets.
